## WHEN EVERY SUNDAY IS "LOW SUNDAY"

**O**f the various names given for the Sunday after Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday, *Quasimodo* Sunday, *Dominica in Albis*) one

of them is "Low Sunday". This is properly meant as the contrast with Easter Sunday which is "High Sunday". "Low Sunday" has also been used ironically, however, to describe the much lower attendance at Church after the surge in church-going for Easter Sunday.

An interesting article appeared in the *Boston Globe* on Good Friday this year, entitled *Membership Plunges in US Churches over Past Twenty Years (April 19th, 2019).* The news story was about a Gallup poll on church membership in the United States. According to Gallup church membership in the United States was 70% in 1999, and had been close to or higher than that figure for most of the 20th Century. At present that figure is only 50%.

Among American Catholics Church membership has dropped from 76 to 63%. Membership among American Protestants has declined in this same 20-year-period from 73 to 67%.

The polling is tracking some strong undertow currents in American life.

- Overall decline in trust in institutions in general and churches in particular.
- A replacement of an older "joiner" generation (i.e., a generation more inclined, or more socialized, to join organizations) with a younger "non-joiner" generation.

"Among Americans 65 and older, church membership in 2016-2018 averaged 64% compared to 41% among those ages 18-29." According to Gallup poll analyst Jeff Jones:

The challenge is clear for churches, which depend on loyal and active members to keep them open and thriving. How do they find ways to convince some of the unaffiliated religious adults in society to make a commitment to a particular house of worship of their chosen faith.

These trends are not just numbers, but play out in the reality that thousands of US churches are closing each year. Religious Americans in the future will likely be faced with fewer options for places of worship, and likely less convenient ones, which could accelerate the decline in membership even more.

Professor Scott Thomas, who teaches sociology of religion at Hartford Seminary, identifies diminished social pressure to formally join organizations as another factor behind church membership decline:

I've encountered many persons in churches that have attended for several years but did not officially join or become a member. This is also evident in persons switching from one congregation to another without joining any.

This poll offers plenty of "food for thought". Scandals and the way they are publicized may offer a ready explanation for declining participation in Catholic parish life but it would seem that the real undermining factors have to do with the ones identified here in this Gallup poll, scandals or not.

## COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL



## **David Allen** ST. JOHN BEFORE THE LATIN GATE

Missale Romanum 1962(MR '62) for this week's column on the Collect's of the Roman Missal, we consider a very old feast day which, although it was removed from the sanctoral cycle in the MR'62, nevertheless remains a viable optional feast for parishes like ours who follow the usus antiquior. The feast is entitled "St. John before the Latin Gate," and it commemorates the attempted martyrdom of St. John in the city of Rome. To this day, a stational Church exists in Rome from which commemorates this event at its location.

In the readings of the Divine Office for this feast day, St. Jerome testifies to this event, referring to its earlier attestation in the writings of the North African priest Tertullian. According to these two patristic witnesses, St. John was apprehended and cast into a boiling vat of oil, but came out completely unhurt. Consequently, the emperor Domitian sent him into exile on the Greek island of Patmos where he died naturally in his old age.

The following is my own translation of the Collect for this feast: "O God, who see that our evils trouble us on all sides: grant, we beseech You, that the glorious intercession of Blessed John, Your Apostle and Evangelist may protect us. Through our Lord, etc. Amen."

To develop the virtue of humility is to come to know ourselves more accurately as we stand before the all-seeing eyes of our good God. In the clear light of truth, humility helps us to know ever more acutely our human poverty and sin, as well as the infinitely greater depths of Christ's love for us, and the power of his grace working in us for salvation. Prayers such as this one above accurately reflect this perspective of the baptized in their lived experience of the

### Christian life.

We know, at times, that it is extremely difficult to bear our cross, and we feel beset on all sides by our evils- that is, by our own sins, our deficiencies in virtue, as well as the temptation and oppression of the devil. In such moments, we are reminded that we rely *at all times* upon Christ and the intercession of his saints.

Truth to tell, the constant presence of the Communion of Saints is both indispensable and integral in sustaining our Christian life, since the saints participate in Christ's mediation before the Father, as we see in the Book of Revelation. This reality is reflected in the Third Eucharistic Prayer of the MR'70: "and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help." Christ and his Bride the Church are never separated.

Within this communion, some saints stand out more than others because of their excelling degree of glory, that is, their excelling degree of union with Christ and their merits. Likewise, among the saints, the Church considers those closest to Jesus in His earthly life to be closest to Him in heaven, as well. This is exactly why we commend ourselves in particular to Our Lady and St. Joseph.

One such saint is St. John the Apostle and Evangelist, "the one Jesus loved," as he refers to himself in his Gospel. In leaning upon him, then, we enjoy greater proximity to Jesus, because St. John himself *leaned* upon the breast of Jesus (cf. Jn. 13:23). The protection afforded us by St. John's "glorious intercession," therefore, is not to be taken lightly. Among the saints, his advocacy is indeed powerful. Let us commend ourselves to St. John for the grace of perseverance in our witness to Christ, as well as the grace of persevering prayer.

# LATIN MASS PROPERS: GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY (2nd SUNDAY AFTER EASTER)

**INTROIT:** Psalm 32. 5-6, 1 The earth is full of the mercy of the Lord, alleluia: by the word of the Lord the heavens were established, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. ibid.* 1. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just; praise becometh the upright. ∛. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. 


