

OCTOBER, THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

The chief devotion for Catholics during the Month of October is

the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is October 7th and today at our 10:30 Latin Mass we will celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary as an External Solemnity. In its historical origins the Feast is a perpetual act of thanksgiving for the deliverance of Christendom from an overwhelming sea-invasion by the Ottoman Turks in 1571 A.D. In Rome, Pope Pius V had authorized public processions of the Rosary to beseech heaven for deliverance. The decisive victory of the much weaker Christian navy over the Ottomans at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7th seemed to be nothing less than miraculous, on a par with the unequal victories by divine power of the Israelites against their mortal foes in the Old Testament.

It was Pope Leo XIII during his long reign (1878 -1903) who greatly expanded the Rosary devotion to include the whole month of October. The "October Devotions" became a part of Catholic life. In the late 1800s, the chief prayer petition of these October Devotions was for the Restoration of the Papal States, which had been suppressed by the armed invasion of the Kingdom of Sardinia in its efforts to forge a new united Kingdom of Italy.

Such a restoration did not occur, but the prayer of the Rosary developed into a more urgent petition for the peace of the world in the wake of the extraordinary events which occurred at Fatima, Portugal, in 1917, and which concluded with the great public sign of the "Miracle of the Sun" on October 13th, 1917. This prayer has lost none of its urgency or relevance to the present day.

It is true that we do not want the prayer of the Rosary to become caught up in a kind of "Rosary-apocalypticism", a rosary-mania where so many rosaries have to be prayed in order for the world not to end or in order for us to effect a certain outcome—a disedifying "weaponizing" of the Rosary which turns the act of prayer inside out. We pray in order to understand better what God's will is for us and how to co-operate with it: we do not pray in order to compel God to do what we want, when we want, and how we want. "Magico-Marianism" should have no place in our Catholic faith life.

Our praying of the Rosary—whether privately or in public recitation—should (like all our prayer) be humble, trusting, patient and persevering. The Mysteries of the Rosary are a most beautiful meditation on the lives of Jesus and Mary. They are rooted in the Sacred Scriptures, and they reenforce and complement our sacramental life.

Pope St. Paul VI, in his advocacy of the prayer of the Rosary, encouraged the expanded meditation on different scenes of the Gospel and particular Scripture verses. No doubt he was speaking from the benefit of his own experience. This method is particularly well-suited to private recitation of the Rosary.

It is not enough to merely pray the Rosary—we must also have the desire to pray the Rosary well. We do not want the Rosary prayer to be an echo chamber of our own egocentricity. Let it be a means of bringing us closer to God. Let it make us more humble. Let it help us to bear our crosses in all patience. Let it teach us how to love.

COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

David Allen OUR LADY OF THE HOLY ROSARY

for our weekly meditation on the

Collects of the Roman Missal, we consider the Collect of today's feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary (Missale Romanum 1962). This Collect is one that almost all Latin Catholics can recite for memory, because it normally concludes one's recitation of the Rosary. It deserves special attention, lest we miss its richness through habitual recitation. The following translation of this Collect is taken from the Angelus Press edition of the Roman Catholic Daily Missal:

"O God, Whose only-begotten Son by His life, death, and resurrection, purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech Thee, that, meditating upon these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through the same our Lord, etc. Amen."

The ascription clause summarizes the chief meditative content of the Rosary prayer: the mysteries of Christ's wondrous life and His supreme Paschal Mystery (His Death and Resurrection). The Church's sense of "mystery" here is that of a divine, historical event which transcends human understanding, in which God reveals Himself in Christ and confers grace on man. We cannot understand these mysteries fully, but by the gift of faith, we can understand them in part, and we can certainly "apprehend" their content by the grace of the Sacraments and through prayer (cf. Peter Kreeft, Catholic Christianity, p. 36; cf. Bl. Columba Marmion, O.S.B., Christ in His Mysteries, 12).

In addition to the life of Christ, the Rosary allows us to meditate on the life of Mary, for she is the one human being who is most closely united to Christ's: mysteries. Put simply, since Christ's saving mysteries indispensably involve Mary, our salvation necessarily involves Mary. The following syllogism proposes the Church's unapologetic teaching about Mary (and the Church herself), which our Collect implies:

- A) Anyone who is saved, is saved by Christ.
- B) Christ has saved and continues to save the world through His Church and through Mary [terms A and B are simply the data of divine revelation].
- *C*) Thus, anyone who is saved, is saved through the Church and through Mary.

In view of this, we consider the Collect's petition clause. We ask God that we may imitate the contents of the mysteries and also obtain their promises (a dual petition, which also functions as a hoped-for outcome). In other words, we are asking God that our own life-stories will participate in the mysteries of Christ and Mary ever more closely. It is not only about moral imitation, but also about receiving the graces contained in each divine event. The Church teaches that the latter is the precondition for the former, for it is the reception of these graces-especially through the Church's Sacraments-but also through prayer, that will enable us to imitate Our Lord and Our Lady.

Since the Rosary is about being interiorly formed into the likeness of Christ through Mary, we hope to receive the benefits of their joint redemptive work, namely, eternal life. Praying the Rosary authentically, therefore, is an act of hope directed toward our eternal salvation. Additionally, even as it directs us toward final Beatitude, the Rosary simultaneously brings the graces of the mysteries into all the circumstances of our present moment. Meditating on the timeless mysteries of Jesus and Mary means that we can orient all of these elements of our daily life, both the sublime and the mundane, to the joy of heaven.

The Collect's crucial motive clause- "meditating upon these mysteries"- implies that a life of devotion is critical in nurturing our faith. Maintaining a prayer life requires discipline, but the joy of this discipline is that there is always more treasure to uncover where the mysteries of faith are concerned. With time, humility, persistence, and faith, Jesus and Mary will lead us to a deeper understanding of and conformity to the will of God and the wonders of his grace and providence.

And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.




