On Monday, May 18th, on the octave day of her 100th Birthday, our oldest parishioner Mrs. Joan of Arc Dougherty died peacefully at her family home in Newton, surrounded by five of her fifteen children. At the time of her death she has 225 descendants (children, grandchildren and great grand-children.) She was named "Joan of Arc" because she was born at the time when Pope Benedict XV canonized Joan of Arc as a new Saint of the Catholic Church. RE-OPENED CHURCH, RESUMED PUBLIC MASSES, BUT STILL UNDER COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

It was unexpected but wonderful news earlier this week when Gov. Charlie Baker lifted his restrictions on Houses of Worship, followed by the Archdiocese of Boston announcing that public Masses could soon resume. To nobody's surprise, long-lists of conditions are attached both to the Governor's and the Archdiocese's announcements.

Based on these conditions I decided not to ask for permission to resume our Sunday public Masses for today, May 24th. We need more time to try to meet what is being required of us. Therefore, our Sunday Mass schedule will not resume until May 31st, 2020, which happens to be the great feast of Pentecost.

One of the COVID-19 restrictions is limiting the attendance at any Mass to 40% of the church building's registered capacity, which for us is 400-seats. I do not think this will be a problem as no Sunday Mass outside of our 10:30 Latin Mass normally exceeds 160 people. In order to help with this I have decided to make the following alterations in our regular parish Sunday Mass Schedule.

- Beginning on Sunday, May 31st, the 10:30 A.M. Latin Mass will become the <u>11:00 A.M.</u> Latin Mass at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes.
- The 5:30 P.M. Sunday Mass will be offered as a second Traditional Latin Mass, instead of a Novus Ordo Mass, also beginning on Sunday, May 31st.

4:00 P. M. (Saturday Vigil) 7:30 A. M. 9:00 A. M. 11:00 A. M. (Traditional Latin Mass) 5:30 P.M. (Traditional Latin Mass)

COVID-19 restrictions also mandate "social distancing" inside the church building. I have determined that it will be easier and safer to "social-distance" by family household here inside the main church of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes if all of the pews remain accessible.

Both the Commonwealth and the Archdiocese oblige the wearing of what amounts to "plague masks" for all people inside the church building, outside of small children and people with personal medical issues. (The priest when he is saying Mass is not obligated to wear a plague mask.)

Among other constraints placed upon us:

- No (or very little) congregational singing.
- No Processions.
- No fellowship time before or after Masses, (i.e., coffee hours.)

Speaking for myself, I bristle at being scolded or condescended to by officialdom, as if we are incapable of acting responsibly—both personally and socially—to manage the risks inherent in a time of contagion, but there it is. No amount of *safety-ism*, however, can make us completely safe. The only way to be completely safe is to be dead.

The Cardinal-Archbishop has not re-instated the Sunday obligation for Mass attendance on account of the risk of disease-spread. Therefore no-one who feels unsafe coming to church in these days should do so. Any one who judges it would be imprudent for them to return to the assembly at Mass should stay home and not scruple about it. We are well-aware that this time of trial is not over.

But let us rejoice that the Mass is restored to the People of God. In the words of Padre Pio: "It would be easier for the earth to carry on without the sun than without the Holy Mass."

COLLECTS OF THE ROMAN MISSAL



Davíd Allen COLLECT (7th SUNDAY OF EASTER) (Missale Romanum 1970)

"Graciously hear our supplications, O Lord, so that we, who believe that the Savior of the human race is with You in Your glory, may experience, as He promised, until the end of the world, His abiding presence among us. Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."

This prayer appropriately reflects the prayerful waiting and anticipation of Our Lady and the Apostles in the Cenacle in Jerusalem between the time of Christ's Ascension and the descent of the Holy Spirit. These nine days are the origin of the tradition of making a *novena* (contains the Latin root for "nine"), or a period of intensified prayer and supplication for a specific intention. Even the word order in the Latin text of our Collect speaks to this time of urgency with which the Church prays for the divine Spirit: "*Supplicationibus nostris*, *Domine...*" are the first words in the text. This Sunday affords us a time of more intensive prayer.

We are praying for a renewal of the Holy Spirit in the Church- certainly- but our Collect conveys more. The ascription clause, usually formulated in reference to God is, in this case, a motive clause related to us. It describes an article of faith we profess in the Creed: "we, who believe that the Savior of the human race is with You in Your glory." We affirm the mystery of Christ's Ascension which we celebrated a few days ago.

This affirmation/motive clause is important, for the exalted Christ in heaven is what gives account for the efficacy of grace in His Church here below. This is what the letter to the Hebrews is all about (and mystogogical catechesis like Blessed Marmion's *Christ in His Mysteries*). It is precisely because Christ is ascended and glorified that He dispenses "*infinite treasures of love*" to us here below, to quote the Collect for the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

This ascription-motive clause of our faith in the mystery of the Ascension serves, then, as the basis of our petition: "that we may experience, as He promised, until the end of the world, His abiding presence among us." Faith and hope in Christ's promises form the rock-solid basis of our pressing "supplicationibus nostris." Specifically, Jesus' promise to remain with us, which can be found in the Last Supper discourses of John 13 -17, frequently center on His gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit, sent by the Risen Christ, makes Him present in His Church sacramentally (most importantly) and otherwise (i.e., the doctrine of the faith, the scriptures, prayer, the virtues of Christian discipleship, etc.).

Indeed, we might say it even more simply: this Collect argues that we are awaiting and asking for the gift of the Holy Spirit, so that He may grant us the gift of the Blessed Sacrament, Christ Himself abiding <u>substantially</u> in His Church. We must not fail to remember that without the presence and action of the Holy Spirit in the Church, there would be no deposit of grace, the "summit" and "font" of which is the Eucharistic Liturgy, as the Second Vatican Council teaches us (cf. Sacrosanctum Concilium no. 10). May this novena prompt us to adore the Blessed Sacrament more devotedly, for Christ Himself in this Sacrament is truly present to us as the Bridegroom and life of the Church, His Bride.
