Pastor's Note

THE FAITH-FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART AND THE HOLY EUCHARIST

following immediately upon Paschaltide the Church

celebrates three great "Faith-Feasts" in succession" Trinity Sunday (Sunday after Pentecost), Corpus Christi (Thursday after Trinity) and the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (Friday after the Octave-day of Corpus Christi). We are celebrating the Sacred Heart at our Mass this Sunday as an "External Solemnity".

This "Faith-Feast" of the Sacred Heart draws us deeper into the Mystery of Faith in the Holy Eucharist. (These excerpts are taken from *Rules for the Spiritual Life* by Fr. José Guadalupe Trevinyo.)

"Jesus, as man, that is in His Sacred Humanity, is not to be found really except in Heaven and in the consecrated Host."

In that Sacred Humanity, which is contained within the Real Presence of the Holy Eucharist, Jesus both sees us and loves us with all of the affections of His Sacred Human Heart.

Jesus not only sees us, He also loves us. He loves us as God, He loves us as man. His Heart, as the Church exclaims in the Preface of the Mass for the Feast of the Sacred Heart, has never ceased to burn with love toward each and every soul.

If the Heart of Jesus loves us, as it certainly does, and if we also love it, as our conscience bears witness that we do, then Jesus and ourselves, far from being separated by the immense distance between heaven and earth, are intimately united by the indestructible bonds of love.

When we are in the presence of the Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist, we do well to foster an awareness of the fact

that we are near Jesus as the One who sees us, who knows everything about us, and who loves us—who purely and simply loves us. In human relations there is always the danger that someone we love will "know" something about us which diminishes us in their eyes, and so maybe they will love us less or even not at all.

That does not happen with God. Knowing us intimately as He does, Jesus Savior continues to love us perfectly. His love is a merciful love, freely given. Of the Holy Eucharist, St. Francis of Assisi said, *"It is the one sensible manifestation that we still have of the Son of God."*

This jubilee Year of the Eucharist in our Archdiocese of Boston, inaugurated last Sunday, is season of grace for us to be renewed by our faith in the Eucharistic Jesus Christ. Three things are important in this regard:

- Know and understand the dogmatic teaching of the Catholic Church on the Holy Eucharist.
- Make use of the devotions of the Church to grow into an even closer relationship to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.
- Seek to pray more and be converted more to Jesus Christ. *Seek to return love for love*.

May the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar, be praised, adored and loved, with grateful affection, on all the altars and in all the tabernacles of the world, now and even to the end of time.

CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

2020 Jubilee 2021 YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST

TRANSUBSTANTIATION

"TRANSUBSTANTIATION" is the mode by which the REAL PRESENCE of Christ is effected in the Holy Eucharist.

The word is defined by the Council of Trent:

"The wonderful and singular conversion of the WHOLE SUBSTANCE of the bread into the BODY OF CHRIST and of the WHOLE SUBSTANCE of the wine into the BLOOD OF CHRIST, the species of bread and wine alone remaining."


This means that—

- Both the matter and form of the bread and wine cease to be.
- The Body and Blood begin to be in a new way.
- The common bond between these two pairs of terms is the species.

There is a "conversion" when hot water becomes cold, but this conversion is a merely accidental change in temperature.

There is a "substantial" conversion when the bread eaten is absorbed by the body, but only one part of the substance is changed, the "form", but the prime matter remains.



LATIN MASS PROPERS: MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

INTROIT: *Psalm 32. 11, 19* The thoughts of His Heart are from generation to generation: To deliver their souls from death and feed them in famine. Ps. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just, praise becometh the upright. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT: O God, Who in the Heart of Thy Son, wounded by our sins, dost mercifully vouchsafe to bestow upon us the infinite wealth of Thy love; grant, we beseech Thee, that revering It with meet devotion, we may fulfil our duty of worthy reparation. Through the same our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Ephesians 3. 8-19* Brethren: To me, the least of all the Saints, is given the grace, to preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ: and to enlighten all men, that they may see what is the dispensation of the mystery which hath been hidden from eternity in God, Who created all things: that the manifold wisdom of God may be made known to the principalities and powers in heavenly places through the Church, according to the eternal purpose which He made in Christ Jesus our Lord: in Whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of Him. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom all paternity in Heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man, that Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts: that being rooted and grounded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the Saints, what is the breadth and length, and height and depth: to know also the charity of Christ which surpasseth all knowledge. That you may be filled unto all the fullness of God.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 24.8,9* The Lord is sweet and righteous: therefore He will give a law to sinners in the way. V. He will guide the mild in judgment: He will teach the meek His ways. **ALLELUIA:** *Matthew 11.29* Alleluia, alleluia. V. Take My yoke upon you and learn of Me, because I am meek and humble of heart: and you shall find rest to your souls. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 19. 31-37 At that time: The Jews (because it was the Parasceve), that the bodies might not Remain on the cross on the Sabbath day (for that was a great Sabbath day), besought Pilate that their legs might be broken: and that they might be taken away. The soldiers therefore came: and they broke the legs of the first, and of the other that was crucified with him. But after they were come to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers, with a spear opened His side, and immediately there came out blood and water. And he knoweth that saw it, hath given testimony: and his testimony is true. And he knoweth that he saith true, that you may believe. For these things were done that the Scripture might be fulfilled: You shall not break a bone of Him. And again another Scripture saith: They shall look on Him Whom they pierced.

OFFERTORY: *Psalm* 68. 21 My Heart hath expected reproach and misery: and I looked for one that would grieve together with Me, but there was none: and for one that would comfort Me, and I found none.

SECRET: Look, we beseech Thee, O Lord, upon the ineffable love of the Heart of Thy beloved Son; that our offering may be acceptable unto Thee and atone for all our sins. Through the same our Lord.
