Pastor's Note

THE HEARTS OF JESUS AND MARY

The stained glass windows in our Lower Church Hall are a remnant of the old parish church of St. Mary's which used to be on Chestnut Street. When the new St. Mary's was being built here in 1909-10, these windows were taken from the old church, together with some of the pews, and used for the downstairs chapel. On opposite sides, there are two

windows which have the emblem of a heart as their top panel: one of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (wrapped in thorns), and the other of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (pierced by a sword).

This is a theologically meaningful juxtaposition. If indeed there is a vital union in the supernatural order between Christ and every baptized Christian this is true in an excellent and unique way of Our Lady. I quote here from Fr. José Guadalupe Trevinyo's *Rules for the Spiritual Life*.

St. Jerome says that all the grace which is found in Christ is found also in the Most Blessed Virgin, although in a different way. Grace is found in Jesus Christ as in our Redeemer and Sanctifier par excellence: it is in the Blessed Virgin as our Co-redemptrix and Mediatrix. This is why we affirm, in contrast to Protestants, that the Blessed Virgin has an indispensable and necessary role in the actual economy of man's sanctification and salvation. In God's actual plan it is not possible to prescind from her, any more than it is possible to prescind from Jesus Christ.

If Jesus Christ is our life, the Most Blessed Virgin Mary is truly our Mother, because

she has given us Jesus Christ. Our relations with the Incarnate Word necessarily include the Blessed Virgin; Jesus Christ does not come to us except through her, nor does grace, the life of our souls, reach us except in passing through Mary. All men ought to have a special devotion to the Mystery of the Immaculate Conception, on order to admire and venerate in this Mystery the fullness of grace which God poured into Mary. In both the Gospel and the Offertory of the Mass of the Immaculate Conception, the Church repeats the angelic salutation: "Ave Maria, gratia plena—Hail Mary, full of grace." Mary received grace in its fullness in order from that fullness to pass on grace to us.

With this background we can be all the more amazed at Our Lady's answer to Bernadette's question, "Would you be so kind as to tell me your name?": I AM THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION.

Into the pure heart of Mary's Immaculate soul has been poured the fullness of Christ's grace (the image of the water from the rock at Lourdes), and from that fullness she passes Christ's grace on to us.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

"EUCHARIST" is from the Greek word meaning "THANKSGIVING".

The Holy Eucharist is one of the Seven Sacraments of the New Law (Testament) in which "under the appearances of bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Christ are truly, really and substantially present, as the grace-producing food of our souls."

"It is true that as much is contained under either species as under both; for Christ whole and entire exists under the species of bread, and under each particle of that species: and whole under the species of wine, and under its separate parts." (Council of Trent)

The Holy Eucharist is the Living Christ:

"As a living body is not without its blood, or living blood without a body, so Christ is received whole and entire under either form of bread or wine."

The use of the word "Eucharist" has its origin in Christ's giving of thanks at the Last Supper.

The Church Father St. Ignatius of Antioch uses the word "Eucharist" to refer to the Blessed Sacrament in his Epistle to the church of Smyrna (A.D. 107)

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 26: 1, 2 The Lord is my light and my salvation: whom shall I fear? The Lord is the protector of my life: of whom shall I be afraid? My enemies that trouble me have themselves been weakened and have fallen. *Psalm* 26: 3 If armies in camp should stand together against me, my heart shall not fear. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by Thee, that Thy Church may joyfully serve Thee in quiet devotion. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Romans 8: 18-23 Brethren, I reckon that the sufferings of this time are not worthy to be compared with the glory to come, that shall be revealed in us. For the expectation of the creature waiteth for the revelation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him that made it subject in hope; because the creature also itself shall be delivered from the servitude of corruption, into the liberty of the glory of the children of God. For we know that every creature groaneth, and travaileth in pain, even till now; and not only it, but ourselves also, who have the first-fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption of the sons of God, the redemption of our body; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOSPEL: Luke 5: 1-11 **A**t that time, when the multitudes pressed upon Jesus to hear the word of God, He stood by the lake of Genesareth. And He saw two ships standing by the lake; but the fishermen were gone out of them, and were washing their nets; and going up into one of the ships that was Simon's, He desired him to draw back a little from the land: and sitting He taught the multitudes out of the ship. Now when He had ceased to speak, He said to Simon: Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. And Simon, answering, said to Him: Master, we have laboured all the night, and have taken nothing, but at Thy word I will let down the net. And when they had done this, they enclosed a very great multitude of fishes; and their net broke: and they beckoned to their partners that were in the other ship, that they should come and help them; and they came, and filled both the ships, so that they were almost sinking. Which when Simon Peter saw, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying: Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord. For he was wholly astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of fishes which they had taken: and so were also James and John the sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. And Jesus saith to Simon: Fear not, from henceforth thou shalt catch men. And having brought their ships to land, leaving all things they followed him.






