FATHER SALAKO'S MISSION APPEAL

Heartfelt thanks to all those who have contributed so generously to the Mission Appeal Collection on behalf of

Fr. Desiré Salako's S.M.A. Province of Benin/ Niger. We are still receiving further gifts and pledges at the time of this writing. At last Sunday's Masses I read Fr. Salako's message to us, outlining some of the concrete needs which our mission support will help him meet. Here below is that message:

My Dear Amiable Fr. Higgins and Parishioners,



I send you warm greetings from Africa, precisely from the Republic of Benin. The present pandemic has made it impossible for me to be present amongst you this

summer physically, but I am united with you in spirit. I will continually remain grateful to you all for all your generosity to our mission here in Benin.

Thanks to your support, we have been able to achieve so much. May the Lord in His goodness reward and keep you in His love. Almost all of the building of the Seminary and the Women's Centre here in Benin were built by you. The Seminary has a dormitory. We would like to transform the dormitory into single rooms because of the risk of the virus transmission, and also for the individual privacy. With the local contribution, we were able to raise the sum of \$5,000. The rooms will cost us about \$30,000.

The training of the girl child-mothers continues. We need the sum of \$2,500 to be

able to continue. So many students have benefited from your generous contributions.

We would like to continue to help the less privileged in our society. For this, we would need \$1,500 as school fees for 10 students.

Getting portable water is another major problem that some people are still facing. We need three wells in three different places and each costs \$1,500. The total cost is \$4,500.

On behalf of all the beneficiaries, the seminarians and myself, I'm saying 'Thank you' for tour financial support and prayers.

The Mystery of the Eucharist Is Verified in the

(continued)

This holy Doctor [St. Cyril of Jerusalem] closes his instruction by citing the parallel of the crown which is woven for the emperor to move him to pardon exiles: "In the same fashion, when we offer our prayers to God for the dead, even though they be sinners, we weave no crown, but instead we offer Christ slaughtered for our sins, beseeching our merciful God to take pity both on them and on ourselves."

St. Augustine testifies that this manner of offering also for the deceased "the Sacrifice which ransomed us" was being faithfully observed in the Church at Rome, and at the same time he observes that the universal Church was following the custom in her conviction that it had been handed down by the earliest Fathers.

To shed fuller light on the mystery of the Church, it helps to realize that it is nothing less than the whole Church which, in union with Christ in His role as Priest and Victim, offers the Sacrifice of the Mass and is offered in it. The Fathers of the Church taught this wondrous doctrine. A few years ago Our predecessor of happy memory, Pius XII, explained it, and only recently the Second Vatican Council


enunciated it in its treatise on the People of God as formulated in its Constitution on the Church.

To be sure, the distinction between universal priesthood and hierarchical priesthood is one of essence and not merely one of degree, and this distinction should be faithfully observed. Yet We cannot fail to be filled with the earnest desire that this teaching on the Mass be explained over and over until it takes root deep in the hearts of the faithful. Our desire is founded on Our conviction that the correct understanding of the Eucharistic Mystery is the most effective means to foster devotion to this Sacrament, to extol the dignity of all the faithful, and to spur their spirit toward the attainment of the summit of sanctity, which is nothing less than the total offering of oneself to service of the Divine Majesty.



LATIN MASS PROPERS: FOURTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 83. 10, 11 BEHOLD, O God, our protector, and look on the face of Thy Christ: for better is one day in Thy courts above thousands. *Ps. ibid.* 2. How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts! my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. $\tilde{\mathbb{V}}$. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Behold, O God ...

COLLECT FAVOR Thy Church unceasingly, O Lord, we beseech Thee, and keep her safe: and because apart from Thee frail man is wont to fall, may she by Thy help be ever withdrawn from harm and guided in good. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Galatians, 5. 16-24. BRETHREN: Walk in the spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lusts of the flesh: for the flesh lusteth against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh; for these are contrary one to another; so that you do not the things that you would. But if you are led by the spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest; which are fornication, uncleanness, immodesty, luxury, idolatry, witchcrafts, enmities, contentions, emulations, wraths, quarrels, dissensions, sects, envies, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like; of the which I foretell you, as I have foretold to you, that they who do such things shall not obtain the Kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is, charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, longanimity, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, chastity. Against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified their flesh with the vices and concupiscences.

GRADUAL: Psalm 117. 8-9. IT is good to confide in the Lord, rather than to have confidence in man. It is good to trust in the Lord, rather than to trust in princes. ALLELUIA: Psalm 94. 1. Alleluia, alleluia. Come, let Come, let us praise the Lord with joy; let us joyfully sing to God our Savior. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, 6. 24-33. AT THAT TIME, Jesus said to His disciples: No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I say to you, be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat, and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air; for they neither sow nor do they reap, nor gather into barns, and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are you not of much more value than they? And which of you, by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? And for raiment why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they labor not, neither do they spin; but I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. Now if God so clothe the grass of the field, which is today, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, how much more you, O ye of little faith! Be not solicitous therefore saying: What shall we eat, or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? for after all these things do the heathens seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the Kingdom of God, and His justice; and all these things shall be added unto you.




