## Pastor's Note

## THOSE WHOSE REST IS WON

**C**ach year the Church begins the Month of November with a thunderous acclamation of the Church Triumphant in Heaven:

"All Saints' Day". In the words of a Missal note:

During the year the Church celebrates one by one the feasts of the saints. Today she joins them all in one festival. In addition to those whose names she knows, she recalls in a magnificent vision all the others "of all nations and tribes standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands," proclaiming Him who redeemed them in His Blood. (St. Andrew Missal, 1958 edition)

The Church's Liturgy for this day of All Saints is one of unmitigated joy. Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B., describes it as the Church "so overflowing with joy, that she seems to be already in possession of eternal happiness." (The Liturgical Year)

The thought of the crown of eternal life won by our loved ones who have died ought to help us manage the inevitable grief caused to us by their loss. "Year by year, as the great solemnity comes round, it has gathered from among our former companions new saints, who bless our tears and smile upon our songs of hope." (Guéranger) The thought of the great assembly of the Blessed ought also to keep us mindful of our own last end. "Year by year the appointed time draws nearer, when we ourselves, seated at the heavenly banquet, shall receive the homage of those who succeed us, and hold out a helping hand to draw them after us to the home of everlasting happiness." (<u>idem</u>)

The Feast of All Saints, November 1st, is followed directly by the Commemoration of All Souls, November 2nd. These holy souls are

saints too. What distinguishes them from the saints of the Church Triumphant in Heaven is that—from the point of view of our solar time—they are still undergoing that mysterious soulpurification after death

which is called "Purgatory". Hence the distinction we make between the "Church Triumphant" in Heaven and the "Church Suffering" in Purgatory. The Church on earth is the "Church Militant."

It is part of our duty in both justice and charity to make prayer and sacrifice for all of the faithful departed, especially for our own family and friends. This is a duty we should be carrying out all the time, but especially during these days of November which is the Month of Remembrance for the Dead. As in past years, All Souls envelopes are available to you at the entrance tables to the church if you wish to list their names and make a memorial gift. These envelopes, as they are received, will be placed on the altar for all of our parish Masses from November 2nd thru November 3oth: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and may perpetual light shine down upon them."

#### LATIN MASS PROPERS: ALL SAINTS

INTROIT Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival-day in honour of all the Saints: at whose solemnity the angels rejoice, and give praise to the Son of God. *Psalm 32:1* Rejoice in the Lord, ye just; praise becometh the upright. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Almighty and everlasting God, who hast given us in one feast to venerate the merits of all Thy saints; we beseech Thee through the multitude of intercessors to grant us the desired abundance of Thy mercy. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Apocalypse 7: 2-12 In those days, behold I, John, saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, having the sign of the living God. And he cried with a loud voice to the four angels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, saying: Hurt not the earth, nor the sea, nor the trees, till we sign the servants of our God in their foreheads. And I heard the number of them that were signed: an hundred and forty-four thousand were signed, of every tribe of the children of Israel. And all the angels stood round about the throne, and the ancients, and the four living creatures; and they fell down before the throne upon their faces, and adored God, saying: Amen, Benediction, and glory, and wisdom, and thanksgiving, honour, and power, and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.

# CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

## 2020 Jubilee 2021 YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST



<u>MYSTERIUM FIDEI</u> ("MYSTERY OF FAITH", ENYCLICAL LETTER OF POPE PAUL VI)

<u>Christ Our Lord Is Present in the Sacrament</u> <u>of the Eucharist by Transubstantiation</u> (continued)

After the Council of Trent, Our predecessor, Pius VI, on the occasion of the errors of the Synod of Pistoia, warned parish priests when carrying out their office of teaching, not to neglect to speak of Transubstantiation, one of the articles of the Faith. Similarly Our predecessor of happy memory, Pius XII, recalled the bounds which those who undertake to discuss the Mystery of Transubstantiation might not cross. We Ourself also, in fulfilment of Our Apostolic Office, have openly borne solemn witness to the faith of the Church at the National Eucharistic Congress held recently at Pisa.

Moreover the Catholic Church has held on to this faith in the presence in the Eucharist of the Body and Blood of Christ, not only in her teaching but also in her practice, since she has at all times given to this great Sacrament the worship which is known as Latria and which may be given to God alone. As St. Augustine says: "It was in His flesh that Christ walked among us and it is His flesh that He has given us to eat for our salvation. No one, however, eats of this flesh without having first adored it...and not only do we not sin in this adoring it, but we would sin if we did not do so.

## Latreutic Worship of the Sacrament of the Eucharist

The Catholic Church has always offered and still offers the cult of Latria to the Sacrament of the Eucharist, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving Consecrated Hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to solemn veneration, and carrying them processionally to the joy of great crowds of the faithful.

In the ancient documents of the Church we have many testimonies of this veneration. The pastors of the church in fact, solicitously exhorted the faithful to take the greatest care in keeping the Eucharist which they took to their homes. "The Body of Christ is meant to be eaten, not to be treated with irreverence," St. Hippolytus warns the faithful.


In fact the faithful thought themselves guilty, and rightly so, as Origen recalls, if after they received the Body of the Lord in order to preserve it with all care and reverence, a small fragment of it fell through negligence.

The same pastors severely reproved those who showed lack of reverence if it happened. This is attested to by Novitianus whose testimony in the matter is trustworthy. He judged as deserving condemnation anyone who came out of Sunday service carrying with him as usual the Eucharist, the sacred Body of the Lord, "not going to his house but running to places of amusement."


