Pastor's Note



Fr. Híggíns **ADVENT AND THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF** MARY

In the interaction of the temporal and sanctoral cycles of

the liturgy we often find that the sanctoral cycle (the cycle of Saints' feasts) intensifies and complements the mysteries recalled in the timecycle of the Year (i.e. Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost.) This is true to an excellent degree with the celebration of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on December 8th.

This dogmatic feast celebrates the singular privilege of Mary as immaculately preserved from all stain of sin by virtue of the foreseen merits of Christ and on account of her other singular privilege of being the Mother of God. In the Incarnation Christ took his human flesh entirely from His mother Mary. Through the Immaculate Conception, the God-Man Jesus is born of flesh unstained by any sin.

These are the two privileges of Mary: the Immaculate Conception and the Divine Maternity. All of the honors, all of the trust we place in Mary's intercession, all of the further theological teaching the Church has developed regarding the "Marian dimension" of Christianity—all of it derives from these two privileges. Understand that and the whole of the Church's Marian life makes perfect sense. It is no exaggeration to say, as St. Bernard of Clairvaux says: "De Maria, numquam satis" (Of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one can never say enough.)

Take away the dogmatic underpinning of Mary, and it dissolves very quickly into sentimentality. Christ Our Lord and Maria Immaculata Our Lady are not to be sentimentalized and rendered as something icky-sweet, something ornamental for a commercialized season emptied of its




FRONT COVER: The Annunciation by Simone Martini and Lippo Memmi, Florence, A.D. 1333

Faith-content. God became Man, *the-Word*made-flesh, in order to take

upon Himself the sin-guilt of the whole world. The Redemption accomplished once-and-for-all upon the Cross, its merits are now continually applied to individual human souls and the world they live in, throughout all the generations in this, the Last Age of the world. At some point unforeseen and unforeseeable by us, when the mysterious number of elect souls has been reached-Christ will return to earth in His Second Advent. The Kingdom of God will then have come in all its fullness.

In the economy of salvation Mary thus has an indispensable role, as Mother and Mediatrix of Grace, Co-redemptrix, Advocate. There is the marvelous phrase associated with St. Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort which encapsulates the great mystery: Ad Jesum per Mariam, "To Jesus through Mary".

The celebration of the Feast of Mary's Immaculate Conception helps us to concentrate our understanding of the Mystery of the Incarnation and to embrace more fully its saving power in our lives.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

INTROIT: Isaias 30, 30; Psalm 79. 2 People of Sion, behold the Lord shall come to save the nations: and the Lord shall make the glory of His voice to be heard, in the joy of your heart. *Psalm*. Give ear, O Thou that rulest Israel: Thou that leadest Joseph like a sheep. \tilde{V} . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — People of Sion, behold ...

COLLECT: Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to prepare the ways of Thine only-begotten Son; that through His coming we may deserve to serve Thee with purified minds. Who with Thee liveth and reigneth, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 15. 4-13 Brethren, What things soever were written, were written for our learning: that, through patience and the comfort of the Scriptures, we might have hope. Now the God of patience and of comfort grant you to be of one mind one towards another, according to Jesus Christ; that with one mind and with one mouth you may glorify God and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Wherefore receive one another, as Christ also hath received you unto the honor of God. For I say that Christ Jesus was minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers: but that the Gentiles are to glorify God for His mercy, as it is written: Therefore will I confess to Thee, O Lord, among the Gentiles, and will sing to Thy Name. And again He saith: Rejoice, ye Gentiles, with His people. And again: Praise the Lord, all ye Gentiles, and magnify Him, all ye people. And again, Isaias saith: There shall be a root of Jesse; and He that shall rise up to rule the Gentiles, in Him the Gentiles shall hope. Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing: that you may abound in hope, and in the power of the Holy Ghost.

GRADUAL: Psalm 49. 2-3, 5 Out of Sion the loveliness of His beauty: God shall come manifestly. Gather ye together His saints to Him, who have set His covenant before sacrifices. ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 121.1* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go unto the house of the Lord. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew 11. 2-10 **A**t that time, when John had heard in prison the works of Christ, sending two of his disciples, he said to Him: Art Thou He that art to come, or look we for another? And Jesus making answer, said to them: Go and relate to John what you have heard and seen. The blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead rise again, the poor have the gospel preached to them: and blessed is he that shall not be scandalized in Me. And when they went their way, Jesus began to say to the multitudes concerning John: What went you out into the desert to see? A reed shaken with the wind? But what went you out to see? A man clothed in soft garments? Behold they that are clothed in soft garments are in the houses of kings. But what went you out to see? A prophet? Yea I tell you, and more than a prophet. For this is he of whom it is written: Behold I send My angel before Thy face, who shall prepare Thy way before Thee.

<u>MYSTERIUM FIDEI</u> ("MYSTERY OF FAITH", ENYCLICAL LETTER OF POPE PAUL VI)

Exhortation to Promote the Cult of the Eucharist (continued)

May the all-good Redeemer who shortly before His death prayed to the Father that all who were to believe in Him would be one even as He and the Father were one, deign speedily to hear out most ardent prayer and that of the entire Church, that we may all with one voice and one faith, celebrate the Eucharistic Mystery and, by participating in the Body of Christ, become one body, linked by those same bonds which He Himself desired for its perfection.

And we turn with paternal affection also to those who belong to the venerable Churches of the Orient, from which come so many most illustrious Fathers whose testimony to the belief of the Eucharist we have so gladly cited in our present letter. Our soul is filled with intense joy as we consider your faith in the Eucharist, which is also our faith, and as we listen to the liturgical prayers by which you celebrate so great a mystery we rejoice to behold your eucharistic devotion, and to read your theologians explaining or defending the doctrine of this most august Sacrament.

May the Most Blessed Virgin Mary from whom Christ Our Lord took the flesh which under the species of bread and wine "is contained, offered and

consumed," may all the saints of God, specially those who burned with a more ardent devotion to the Divine Eucharist, intercede before the Father of mercies so that from this same faith in and devotion toward the Eucharist may result and flourish a perfect unity of communion among all Christians.

Unforgettable are the words of the holy martyr Ignatius, in his warning to the faithful of Philadelphia against the evils of division and schism, the remedy for which lies in the Eucharist: "Strive then," he said, "to make use of one form of thanksgiving for the flesh of Our Lord Jesus Christ is one and one is the chalice of in the union of His Blood, one altar, one bishop."

Encouraged by the most consoling hope of the blessings, which will accrue to the whole Church and the entire world from an increased in devotion to the Eucharist, with profound affection We impart to you, venerable brothers, to the priests, Religious and all those who collaborate with you and to all the faithful entrusted to your care, the apostolic benediction as a pledge of heavenly graces.
