
THE APPARITION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY AT LOURDES: OUR PARISH PATRONAL FEAST

Coday our Sunday Mass is the Mass for the Apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary Immaculate at Lourdes, observed in its External Solemnity. The actual feast-day falls on February 11th, Thursday of this coming week.

The Patronal Feast of a parish church is one of the most important days of the year and deserves a great deal of attention being brought to it. The wonderful events at Lourdes in 1858 were a further confirmation of the Catholic dogma of Mary's Immaculate Conception, solemnly defined by Pope Pius IX in 1854. The underground spring coming up from under the great rock of the Massabielle (the "Lourdes spring") was another important sign that was given.

It is not sufficiently appreciated how much the Apparitions at Lourdes correlate to the Church's baptismal catechesis of Lent. This year 2021, the Temporal Cycle lines up exactly as it did in 1858 so that we are able to see it clearly as we live Lent. On our Catechesis page in our weekly parish bulletin I would like set forth the way in which this correlation works in a series entitled "The Lourdes Catechism". Since the on-going pandemic will prevent us from having our customary Parish Lenten Mission with the Stations of the Cross on Friday nights, I want to offer you this series in its place as material for your own Lenten spiritual reflection.

An artificial distinction is all too often made in discussing Apparitions between theology and the devotion of people's faith. Marian Apparitions like Lourdes, it is alleged, are for people's personal experiential faith whereas theology is the "official religion" of the priests. The priests therefore try to impose the





"official religion" on the free-floating

experience of ordinary people around what is essentially undefinable and unknowable. Hence the effort to recover the "real" Lourdes from the clerical Lourdes. It is interesting to note the parallel between contemporary efforts to assert a "real" free-floating early Christianity as against the orthodox Christianity of dogmatic definitions and bishops' authority.

As I hope to demonstrate in this "Lourdes Catechism" such an assertion is itself an artificial academic exercise. The more we scrutinize the Apparitions at Lourdes the more clearly we discern the pattern of the Church's baptismal catechesis which gives shape to the liturgies of Lent.

As our Blessed Lady has no office apart from bringing people closer to her Divine Son Jesus Christ, so she is a most brilliant and direct catechist when she appears on earth to give a message.

PLEASE DO NOT TRY TO CIRCUMVENT THE UNIVERSAL FACE-MASK MANDATE:

Over the past week we have had several unpleasant incidents of belligerence and emotional upset from people in church who did not like being asked to wear a face-covering or to make sure it was properly worn over the nose and mouth. The face-mask requirement is a public health mandate: it is prescriptive and not directive. Therefore, we have no discretion on how to apply it. Complaints have been lodged against us with the city and state Public Health departments for precisely this-lax enforcement of the face-mask mandate. Gov. Baker's directive on Houses of Worship allows the imposition of \$500 fines for each and every violation. Boards of Public Health can order the closure of a House of Worship based on lax enforcement of the face-mask mandate alone. In the interests of protecting the common good of the whole parish, individuals who are unable for whatever reason to comply with the face-mask mandate cannot come here into church until the contagion controls are lifted.

CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

The LOURDES CATECHISM

Following his Pilgrimage to Lourdes in August, 1908, the Fiftieth Jubilee of the 1858 Apparitions, Monsignor Robert Hugh Benson, a prominent Catholic convert in his day, wrote: "Lourdes, as a whole, is an excellent little compendium of Catholic theology and Gospeltruth." (Lourdes) This is an astute observation, even more so when we consider the sequence of these Eighteen Apparitions to the seer Bernadette Soubirous.

The Apparitions map out a significant correlation with the Church's Easter Cycle of the Year. Each year, beginning with Septuagesima Sunday, the Church begins her renewal in anticipation of the Easter Feast. According to the older form of the Roman Rite, which was in place until the Pauline Reform of 1970, Ash Wednesday was preceded by three Sundays of pre-Lent. The readings of the Mass and Divine Office laid out the framework for Christ's Redemptive Act. Then, with Ash Wednesday the Forty Day fast of Lent began, culminating with the celebration of the Sacred Triduum (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Eve).

The daily Masses during Lent, especially in the traditional Roman Missal, reflect what was the Baptismal Catechesis for those catechumens preparing for Baptism at Easter. In the 4th and 5th Centuries A.D. the Catechumenate was flourishing as large numbers of people sought to become baptized Christians. In the city of Rome, the people gathered with the Pope for daily Mass at specific churches during Lent, which changed according to the different days. The Mass formulas were directed towards those on the Catechumens' benches, both re-enforcing what they had been learning over their earlier periods of preparation (catechumenates were typically years-long) and giving them new knowledge. Many of the faithful accompanied the catechumens to the Lenten daily Masses. Although already baptized the faithful too benefited from hearing the lessons and deepening their own conversion to Christ.

Besides the catechumens, there was another group of people who were the object of the Lenten daily Mass. These were the *penitents*, baptized Christians who had grievously and publicly sinned after their Baptism and so were excommunicate. At the same time as the catechumens were preparing for Baptism over 40 days, the people who were bound to do public penance as a condition of re-admission to Communion carried out that penance over 40 days.

So in the patrimony of the Church's Lenten liturgies which has been handed down to us we see three layers of liturgical development, directed variously at the catechumens, the penitents and the faithful. In the Roman Rite it is all mixed in together but we can discern its shades and hues.

In the timing of the Apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary Immaculate to Bernadette Soubirous at Lourdes, the First Apparition (February 11th, 1858) was on the Thursday before Ash Wednesday; the Second Apparition (February 14th) was Shrove Sunday; the Third (February 18th) was on Thursday after Ash. The "Fortnight" of Apparitions began on the Friday after Ash and lasted through March 4th, Thursday of the Second Week in Lent (Apparitions 4-15). The Sixteenth Apparition, March 25th, was the Feast of the Annunciation and also Thursday in Passion Week. The Seventeenth Apparition was on Easter Wednesday. Thus 17 of the 18 Apparitions run parallel to the Church's Easter Catechesis.


