CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

The LOURDES CATECHISM

Baptismal Regeneration



In the course of the wonderful events at Lourdes in 1858 two signs were given to the world: 1) the appearance of the underground spring flowing out of the side of the great rock (February 25th), and 2) the self-identification of Mary with her privilege of the Immaculate Conception, "I am the JESUS TRUST NYOU Immaculate Conception",

(March 25th). At the time, the revelation of the name after Bernadette's pleading- "Would you be so kind as to give me your name?"-was hailed by Church authorities as heavenly confirmation of the solemn dogmatic definition of Mary's Immaculate Conception by Pope Pius IX only four years' before, in 1854. It alone was weighed as the confirmation of the authenticity of Bernadette's visions. The first authorization for liturgical worship around the Apparitions of Lourdes was for a Mass in Honor of Mary Immaculate. The Lourdes feast-day on February 11th reflects the Mass of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on December 8th. It is tantamount to a Second Feast of the Immaculate Conception on the Sanctoral Calendar.

This emphasis on the second sign, however, has been to the detriment of fully bringing out the impact of the first sign-the water flowing

from the side of the great rock of the Massabielle. Rather than it being a concession to pre-Christian popular ideas of enchanted nature-religion, the Lourdes spring, in the context of the Church's Lenten liturgies, is steeped in the Ancient Church's presentation of the **Mysteries of Baptismal**



Regeneration. It is a further example of a biblical "water lesson" analogy used for the catechumens.

In the Old Testament, during the long sojourn in the desert after the Exodus from Egypt, the people were without water. God therefore told Moses to strike a rock with his staff. "And when Moses had lifted up his hand, and struck the rock twice with his rod, there came forth water in great abundance, so that the people and their cattle drank." (Numbers 20) Both Moses and the rock are treated as figures of Christ. The water flowing from the side of the rock in the desert is an image of the Water and Blood which flowed from Christ's side on Good Friday, which John the Apostle saw: "But one of the soldiers with a spear opened up His side: and immediately there came out Blood and Water." (John 19:34)

Just so, the Lourdes spring, flowing from the side of the Massabielle at the exact point where Our Lady told Bernadette to drink even though it was at that moment still only dirt, is also an image of the Water and Blood flowing from Christ's side on Good Friday. The image of St. Faustina's Divine Mercy, with its two beams of light, one white, one red, and the image of the Lourdes spring are iconic of the same Mystery of the Baptismal Regeneration. The Water is Baptism, the Red is the Holy Eucharist: Baptism begins the supernatural life, Holy Eucharist matures it. Together they are the one Baptismal Regeneration and **Easter Sacrament.**

LATIN MASS PROPERS: LAETARE SUNDAY

INTROIT: Isaias 66: 10, 11 Rejoice, O Jerusalem: and come together all you that love her: rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow: that you may exult, and be filled from the breasts of your consolation. *Psalm 121: 2* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Grant, we beseech Thee, O almighty God, that we, who for our evil deeds justly deserve to be punished, by the comfort of Thy grace may mercifully be relieved. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Galatians 4: 22-31 Lesson from the Epistle of blessed Paul the Apostle to the Galatians. Brethren: It is written that Abraham had two sons: the one by a bondwoman and the other by a free woman. But he who was of the bondwoman was born according to the flesh: but he of the free woman was by promise: which things are said by an allegory. For these are the two testaments. The one from Mount Sinai, engendering unto bondage: which is Agar: for Sinai is a mountain in Arabia, which hath affinity to that Jerusalem which now is, and is in bondage with her children. But that Jerusalem which is above is free, which is our mother. For it is written: Rejoice, thou barren that bearest not: break forth and cry, thou that travailest not: for many are the children of the desolate, more than of her that hath a husband. Now we, brethren, as Isaac was, are the children of promise. But as then he that was born according to the flesh persecuted him that was after the spirit: so also it is now. But what saith the scripture? Cast out the bondwoman and her son: for the son of the bondwoman shall not be heir with the son of the free woman. So then, brethren, we are not the children of the bondwoman, but of the free: by the freedom wherewith Christ has made us free.

GRADUAL: Psalm 121: 1, 7 I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. *V*. Let peace be in Thy strength: and abundance in Thy towers. **TRACT:** Psalm 124: 1-2 They that trust in the Lord shall be as Mount Sion: he shall not be moved for ever that dwelleth in Jerusalem. *V*. Mountains are round about it: so the Lord is round about His people, from henceforth now and for ever.

GOSPEL: John 6: 1-15. At that time Jesus went over the sea of Galilee, which is that of Tiberias: and a great multitude followed Him, because they saw the miracles which He did on them that were diseased. Jesus therefore went up into a mountain: and there He sat with His disciples. Now the pasch, the festival day of the Jews, was near at hand. When Jesus therefore had lifted up His eyes, and seen that a very great multitude cometh to Him, He said to Philip: Whence shall we buy bread that these may eat? And this He said to try him: for He Himself knew what He would do. Philip answered Him: Two hundred pennyworth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one may take a little. One of His disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, saith to Him: There is a boy here that hath five barley loaves and two fishes: but what are these among so many? Then Jesus said: Make the men sit down, in number about five thousand. And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks, He distributed to them that were set down. Now there was much grass in the place. The men therefore sat down, in number about five thousand. And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks, He distributed to them that were set down: in like manner also of the fishes, as much as they would. And when they were filled, He said to His disciples: Gather up the fragments that remain, lest they be lost. They gathered up therefore, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which remained over and above to them that had eaten. Now those men, when they had seen what a miracle Jesus had done, said: This is of a truth the prophet that is to come into the world. Jesus therefore when He knew that they would come to take Him by force and make Him king, fled again into the mountain. Himself alone.


