

SAINT MARGARET OF CASTELLO: AN "EQUIPOLLENT" CANONIZATION



St. Margaret of Castello's canonization was done without any formal process. It was, instead, what is called an "equipollent" canonization. Pope Francis pronounced her life one of heroic virtue and confirmed that devotion which already exists towards her.

Such a way of canonizing a saint is outside the norm but it is not unheard of. Some examples of Saints long venerated as such who have received an "equipollent" canonization are: Saints Cyril and Methodius, St. Albert the

Great, St. Hildegard of Bingen, St. Thomas More, and St. Bede the Venerable.

"Little Margaret's" life-story is an example of how God chooses the lowliest and the "little ones" in place of the strong and the wise in human terms. She was, as we would describe it now, a "special needs" child. She had dwarfism, severe curvature of the spine, and was blind. Her well-to-do parents were horrified that they had a defective child. When she was only six they had her walled up in a room beside the family chapel. They sealed the room's door after she was placed inside. Bereft of any human care or comfort they passed food into her on a tray but abandoned her to die there. When she did not die soon enough the family allowed a priest to speak to her through the food window. In this way she was catechized and received the Holy Eucharist. Here is a picture of the place in which she was immured as a sixyear-old child:



When she was fifteen her parents took her to a Franciscan shrine in the town of Castello where people had been experiencing miracles. There her mother asked for a miraculous cure of all of the girl's infirmities. The miracle not occurring the family abandoned her then and there.

The abandoned Margaret slept in doorways or in the streets. Local beggars taught her how to beg. People in the town began to compassionate her, giving her shelter in bad weather. Eventually she was given shelter in a convent. She came to know the Dominican friars and became herself a Third-Order Dominican, wearing the habit of a Dominican.

Of her disposition: "Despite her suffering, Saint Margaret remained serene, calm, cheerful and courageous. She never became bitter, complained, criticized others or became discouraged. She went to Mass daily, and prayed fervently to Jesus, Mary, Joseph and St. Dominic. St. Margaret accepted her sufferings with the eyes of faith. She did not know why God allowed her to suffer from so many afflictions, yet she did know that He was

All-good, and did not allow evil without a good reason and always turned evil into good for His children. She wondered why people pitied her: Was it not a privilege to suffer with Christ? Suffering for her was her way to Heaven.

Margaret returned the compassion shown her by the people of Castello with her own loving heart:

Margaret loved the people of Castello who loved her when no-one else had. After she became a Dominican she resolved to spend the rest of her life serving them. She opened a kind of school in town to catechize children. She visited local prisoners, and brought back at least some, who had abandoned the faith, to repentance and confession. She took care of sick and dying people. She was present and prayerful among the people of Castello, and the entire city grew to love her.

When she died at age 33, the people of Castello demanded she be buried inside the church—an honor reserved mostly for nobles and priests. The entire town attended her funeral; and a young girl unable to walk was said to be cured during the Mass.

As a further sign of Heaven's favor, her body remained incorrupt.



How fitting Pope Francis's canonization of St. Margaret of Costello is in a world where the dignity of human life is so devalued and the experience of human abandonment so rampant.


