THE SAINTS, OUR FRIENDS IN HEAVEN

n this Sunday within the Octave of All Saints we continue to dwell in spirit in the heavenly realms of the Church

Triumphant. The Roman Martyrology entry for November 1st reads:

The Festival of All Saints, which Pope Boniface IV, after the dedication of the Pantheon, ordained to be kept generally and solemnly every year, in the City of Rome, in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and of the

holy martyrs. It was afterwards decreed by Gregory IV that this feast, which was then celebrated in many dioceses, but at different times, should be on this day kept by the whole Church in honor of All Saints.

The Church's Year of Grace is rising to a crescendo with the celebration of All Saints. This Month of November which follows emphasizes the remembrance of the dead. In our prayers the theme of the Four Last Things—Death, Judgment, Heaven, Hell—should be paramount at this time of the year. All passes and quickly passes, and then comes eternity—happy or miserable as the case may be.

We know that God is superabundant in the making of His Saints, so there is no cause for discouragement. By the grace of God, we shall reach Heaven, our true Last End.






