WELCOMING IN SEPTUAGESIMA

Today is Septuagesima Sunday on the old Roman Calendar. It ushers in the brief 17-day space of pre-Lent known as


Septuagesima. Ten weeks from today is Easter Sunday (April 17th). Septuagesima is the Latin word for "seventieth": from today Easter is (approximately) seventy days away.

In the Missal Reform of Paul VI, Septuagesima was eliminated as a liturgical piece. We go right into the "deep-end" of Lent on Ash Wednesday, without any preparation.

It is a loss and among liturgists themselves the decision to eliminate Septuagesima in the Missal reform was controversial. Perhaps at some future date we may see it re-inserted?

Even so, whether we find it in the Roman Missal or not, Septuagesima still offers us as Catholics a very profitable spiritual exercise. It is an opportune space of "pre-Lent" for us to think on how we might make a good Lent this year. These are the days for us to make our good resolutions, lay out a practical plan, and pray for the grace to carry it out. Then, when Ash Wednesday comes on March 2nd, we are ready to "hit the ground running", so to speak.

The number 70 has an important meaning for the history of Israel in the Bible. Seventy years was the length of the exile for the war-captives who were carried off into slavery in Babylon after the destruction of Jerusalem (586 B.C.). Seventy then lends itself to being a mystic number which stands for earthly exile from our true homeland, God's Eternal Heaven. The return of the exiles and their descendants after seventy years to rebuild Jerusalem is an image of the Redemption by Jesus Christ, a figure of Christ bringing the first saved souls with Him into Heaven on Ascension Day.




During Lent we are invited to place ourselves, in spirit, in the state of un-redemption and then, over the course of the Lenten discipline, purify our hearts of earthly-mindedness and half-hearted, "ho-hum" ways of being a Christian. Conversion is a continuing process: we are never done with it as long as we live upon this earth.

So then, let us make good use of our days of Septuagesima now to prepare our personal Lenten program for Easter, 2022. Every stage of earthly life is so precious for eternity. The Lourdes' Apparitions themselves in 1858 were re-enforcements of the Early Church's Baptismal Catechesis and the Message of Redemption.

Among the Romans, the day like the night was divided into four parts of three hours each. They were called stations or watches because they were the moments when the soldiers relieved one another. These hours varied in length with the different seasons, for the official day and night corresponded with our midday and midnight respectively.



LATIN MASS PROPERS: SEPTUAGESIMA SUNDAY

INTROIT: Ps. 17. 5, 6, 7 The sorrows of death surrounded me, the of hell encompassed me: and in my affliction I called upon the Lord, and He heard my voice from His holy Temple *Psalm 17. 2-3* I will love Thee, O Lord, my strength: the Lord is my firmament, my refuge, and my deliverer. *V. G*lory be to the Father. COLLECT Graciously hear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the prayers of Thy people, that we who are justly afflicted for our sins, may be mercifully delivered by Thy goodness for the glory of Thy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 9. 24-27; 10. 1-5 Brethren: Know you not that they that run in the race, all run indeed, but one receiveth the prize? So run that you may obtain. And every one that striveth for the mastery refraineth himself from all things: and they indeed that they may receive a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible one. I therefore so run, not as at an uncertainty; I so fight, not as one beating the air: but I chastise my body, and bring it into subjection, lest perhaps when I have preached to others, I myself should become a castaway. For I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all in Moses were baptized, in the cloud and in the sea: and all did eat the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink: (and they drank of the spiritual rock that followed them: and the rock was Christ). But with most of them God was not well pleased.

GRADUAL: Psalm 9. 10-11, 19-20 A helper in due time in tribulation: let them trust in Thee who know Thee: for Thou hast not forsaken them that seek Thee, O Lord. *V*. For the poor man shall not be forgotten to the end: the patience of the poor shall not perish forever: arise, O Lord, let no man prevail. TRACT: Psalm 129. 1-4 Out of the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice *V*. Let Thine ears be attentive to the prayer of Thy servant. *V*. GOSPEL: Matthew 20. 1-16 At that time Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven is like to a householder who went out early in the morning to hire labourers into His vineyard. And having agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard. And going out about the third hour, he saw others standing in the market place idle, and he said to them: Go you also into my vineyard, and I will give you what shall be just. And they went their way. And again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour: and did in like manner. But about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing, and he saith to them: Why stand you here all the day idle? They say to him: Because no man hath hired us. He saith to them: Go you also into my vineyard. And when evening was come, the lord of the vineyard saith to his steward: Call the labourers and pay them their hire, beginning from the last even to the first. When therefore they were come that came about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. But when the first also came, they thought that they should receive more: and they also received every man a penny. And receiving it they murmured against the master of the house, saying: These last have worked but one hour, and thou hast made them equal to us that have borne the burden of the day and the heats. But he answering said to one of them: Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst thou not agree with me for a penny? Take what it is thine and go thy way: I will also give to this last even as to thee. Or is it not lawful for me to do what I will? Is thy eye evil, because I am good? So shall the last be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen.
