CORPUS CHRISTI

Today we happily resume the custom of our Parish Corpus Christi Procession, the first since 2019. It is also the close of the extended jubilee of the

Year of the Eucharist in our Archdiocese of Boston. Today's Procession will follow directly from the conclusion of the 11 AM Mass (for those attending another Sunday Mass who wish to come for the Procession only, the Procession should be getting underway at approximately 12:30 PM).

The first hymn of the Procession as the Eucharistic Canopy makes its way through the nave of the church is the *Pange Lingua*. Upon the return to church, the Solemn *Te Deum* is sung as the Blessed Sacrament is borne back to the high altar. We will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

SYNOD RESPONSE

Age Range


How would you describe your ethnic/cultural background?







