PENTECOST AND THE CLOSE OF PASCHALTIDE

Coday we reach the culmination of our celebration of the Easter

Feast: The Day of Pentecost, the fiftieth day of Easter. It is the third of the three great Easter Feasts—Easter Sunday of the Resurrection, Ascension Thursday, Pentecost (or Whitsunday); it is the inaugural of the divine institution of the Catholic Church. St. Augustine of Hippo (+430 A.D.) contrasts the 40 Days of the Lenten Fast with the 50 Days of the Easter Feast. The Easter Feast is longer by ten days, which indicates both the superiority of the feast over the fast and the mystical sign of Eternity. On this Feast of Pentecost, it is fitting to recall St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit, a fairly easy one to memorize and make part of our own personal devotion.

St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit That my thought may be all holy.

Act in me, O Holy Spirit That my work, too, may be holy.

Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit That I love but what is holy.

Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit To defend all that is holy.

Guard me, then, O Holy Spírít That I always may be holy.

Amen.






INTROIT: Wisdom 1: 7 The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which containeth all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. 
