


of the Polish struggle against Nazi Germany. Stan fought with the Polish army in September, 1939, was captured and escaped six times, and then, after Poland was overrun, went into exile and joined the Polish Legion fighting with the Allies. Maria was among the young women of the Polish Home Army who fought in the Warsaw Uprising of 1944. She was deported into Germany until the end of the War. Stan, who had known her family before the War, saw her name on the Displaced Persons list and took an army truck from Rome to find her.

A most persistent suitor, Stan persuaded Maria to go back with him to Rome, where they were married. Their journey eventually brought them here to Newton Upper Falls and Mary Immaculate of Lourdes parish, where they raised their five children.

Given their history, I thought it most poignant that each of them should have died, a year apart, flanking John Paul II's Feast-day-Stan died on October 21st, 2016, and Maria died on October 23rd, 2017. Last Sunday's 5:30 PM Mass was offered for the repose of their souls, at the request of their daughter Christine (Schroter) Tramontozzi. Requiescant in Pace.

SCRIPTURE READINGS for the TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY PER ANNUM (YEAR A)

(TODAY'S MISSAL, pp. (64-66)

Lesson (First Reading): The Book of the Prophet Isaiah 45:1,4-6 (Cyrus, as a figure of Christ, the great deliverer of God's people.) Epistle (Second Reading): I Thessalonians 1:1-5b ("We give thanks to God for all of you.") Gospel Lesson: Render Unto God the Things That Are God's... Matthew 22:15-21 (1962 Missal: 22nd Sunday after Pentecost)

LATIN MASS PROPERS: TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Esther 13: 9, 10-11 All things are in Thy will, O Lord; and there is none that can resist Thy will: for Thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. *Psalm 118: 1* Blessed are the undefiled in the way; who walk in the law of the Lord. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Lord, we pray Thee, keep Thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through Thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to good works, to the glory of Thy holy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Ephesians 6: 10-17 Brethren: Be strengthened in the Lord, and in the might of His power. Put you on the armour of God, that you may be able to stand against the deceits of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. Therefore, take unto you the armour of God, that you may be able to stand in all things perfect; stand therefore having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of justice, and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; in all things taking the shield of faith, wherewith you may be able to extinguish all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God.


GRADUAL: Psalm 89: 1-2 Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. *V*. Before the mountains were made, or the earth and the world was formed; from eternity and to eternity Thou art God. **ALLELUIA:** Psalm 113: 1 Alleluia, alleluia. *V*. When Israel went out of Egypt, the house of Jacob from a barbarous people. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Matthew 18: 23-35 At that time Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of Heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. But that servant falling down, besought him saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go, and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow-servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying: Pay what thou owest. And his fellow-servant falling down besought him, saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not; but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. Now his fellow-servants, seeing what was done, were very much grieved; and they came and told their lord all that was done. Then his lord called him, and saith to him: Thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all the debt, because thou besoughtest me; shouldst not thou then have had compassion also on thy fellow-servant, even as I had compassion on thee? And his lord being angry delivered him to the torturers until he paid all the debt. So also shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts. OFFERTORY: Job 1: 2 There was a man in the land of Hus, whose name was Job, simple, and upright, and fearing God: whom Satan besought that he might tempt: and power was given him from the Lord over his possessions and his flesh; and he destroyed all his substance and his children; and wounded his flesh also with a grievous ulcer.
