

Recently a book has appeared about the contemporary social reality of American religion entitled: The Great De-Churching: Who's Leaving? Why Are They Going? And What Will It Take To Bring Them Back?, by Jim Davis and Michael Graham, with Ryan Burge. It argues that, across-theboard, Americans are presently falling away from the practice of synagogue) going


religion in such numbers that it represents a reverse of the previous religious revival "Great Awakenings" of American history, hence the coining of the term: "The Great De-Churching".

It is a hard truth for any church congregation to face (of any religious denomination) and the existential challenges it presents to the maintenance of already well-established churches are obvious. In the midst of all of our particular challenges to keep the doors of this church of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes open, we also have to contend against these strong cultural headwinds which are outside of our control.
