THE HOLY HOUSE OF LORETO

mecember 10th is the day appointed for the Feast of the Translation of the Holy House of Loreto, the House "translated"

from Palestine by the ministry of angels—in which was born the Blessed Virgin Mary, and in which the Word was made flesh." (Benedict XV, 1916) The Collect prayer for this Mass offers us a solid theological thought for Advent reflection: O God, Who in Thy mercy didst hallow the house of the Blessed Virgin Mary by the mystery of the Word made flesh, and didst wonderfully place it in the midst of Christendom: grant that we may shun the dwellings of sinners, and become worthy to dwell in Thy holy house. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

ROMAN STATIONAL CHURCH SECOND SUNDAY IN THE ADVENT OF THE LORD: CHURCH OF THE HOLY CROSS-AT-JERUSALEM

"In Palestine Christians gather today in Jerusalem for the celebration of holy Mass. In Rome they proceed to the stational church 'Holy Cross at Jerusalem' which serves to give the atmosphere of the Holy City...Already now the Church sings of the [heavenly] Jerusalem. For during Advent we await the Savior who will appear on the Last Day to take all into the 'new Jerusalem coming down from heaven'...On Epiphany, the climax to the current season, the Church will cry out: Arise, shine, O Jerusalem, for the glory of the Lord has risen upon thee...Today we must prepare for the great King's visit to the city [of our soul]. The whole coming week must be devoted to it. The Church prays: Awaken our hearts to prepare the way for Your Only-Begotten Son that we may serve Him with purified hearts."


Please join us in buying requested gift-donations from the tags on our parish "Giving-Tree", which will be set up on Sunday, November 26th.





LATIN MASS PROPERS: SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

INTROIT: Isaias 30, 30; Psalm 79. 2 People of Sion, behold the Lord shall come to save the nations: and the Lord shall make the glory of His voice to be heard, in the joy of your heart. *Psalm*. Give ear, O Thou that rulest Israel: Thou that leadest Joseph like a sheep. \hat{V} . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — People of Sion, behold ...

COLLECT: Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to prepare the ways of Thine only-begotten Son; that through His coming we may deserve to serve Thee with purified minds. Who with Thee liveth and reigneth, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 15. 4-13 Brethren, What things soever were written, were written for our learning: that, through patience and the comfort of the Scriptures, we might have hope. Now the God of patience and of comfort grant you to be of one mind one towards another, according to Jesus Christ; that with one mind and with one mouth you may glorify God and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Wherefore receive one another, as Christ also hath received you unto the honor of God. For I say that Christ Jesus was minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers: but that the Gentiles are to glorify God for His mercy, as it is written: Therefore will I confess to Thee, O Lord, among the Gentiles, and will sing to Thy Name. And again He saith: Rejoice, ye Gentiles, with His people. And again: Praise the Lord, all ye Gentiles, and magnify Him, all ye people. And again, Isaias saith: There shall be a root of Jesse; and He that shall rise up to rule the Gentiles, in Him the Gentiles shall hope. Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing: that you may abound in hope, and in the power of the Holy Ghost.

GRADUAL: Psalm 49. 2-3, 5 Out of Sion the loveliness of His beauty: God shall come manifestly. Gather ye together His saints to Him, who have set His covenant before sacrifices. ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm* 121. 1 I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go unto the house of the Lord. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew 11. 2-10 At that time, when John had heard in prison the works of Christ, sending two of his disciples, he said to Him: Art Thou He that art to come, or look we for another? And Jesus making answer, said to them: Go and relate to John what you have heard and seen. The blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead rise again, the poor have the gospel preached to them: and blessed is he that shall not be scandalized in Me. And when they went their way, Jesus began to say to the multitudes concerning John: What went you out into the desert to see? A reed shaken with the wind? But what went you out to see? A man clothed in soft garments? Behold they that are clothed in soft garments are in the houses of kings. But what went you out to see? A prophet? Yea I tell you, and more than a prophet. For this is he of whom it is written: Behold I send My angel before Thy face, who shall prepare Thy way before Thee.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 84. 7-8 Thou wilt turn, O God, and bring us to life, and Thy people shall rejoice in Thee: show us, O Lord, Thy mercy, and grant us Thy salvation.

SECRET: Be appeased, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the prayers and sacrifices of our humility: and where merits of ours to plead for us are lacking, do Thou by Thine aid assist us. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ...

COMMUNION: Baruch 5. 5; 4. 36 Arise, O Jerusalem, and stand on high, and behold the joy that cometh to thee from thy God.

POSTCOMMUNION: Filled with the food of spiritual nourishment, we humbly entreat Thee, O Lord, that by our partaking of this Mystery, Thou wouldst teach us to despise the things of earth, and to love those of Heaven. Through our Lord ...


