## **Pastor's Note**



Fr. Higgins **TIME AFTER EPIPHANY: OCTAVE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR** CHRISTIAN UNITY, JANUARY 18th-25th

€piphanytide is completed, but the Time-after— Epiphany keeps us within the Christmas feastspan of 40 days, as Dom Prosper Guéranger reminds us:



We apply the name of Christmas to the forty days which begin with the NATVITY of OUR LORD, December 25th, and end with the PURIFICATION of the BLESSED VIRGIN, February 2nd. It is a period which forms

a distinct portion of the Liturgical Year, as distinct, by its own special spirit, from every other, as are Advent, Lent, Easter, or Pentecost. One same Mystery is celebrated and kept in view during the whole forty days. Neither the Feasts of the Saints, which so abound during this Season; nor the time of Septuagesima, with its mournful Purple, which often begins before Christmastide is over, seem able to distract our Holy Mother the Church from the immense JOY of which she received the good tidings from the Angels on that glorious Night.....The custom of celebrating the Solemnity of Our Savior's Nativity by a feast or commemoration of forty days' duration is founded on the Holy Gospel itself; for it tells us that the Blessed Virgin Mary, after spending forty days in the contemplation of the Divine Fruit of her glorious Maternity, went to the Temple, there to fulfill, in most perfect humility, the ceremonies which the Law demanded of the daughters of Israel, when they became mothers.

The yearly Octave Week of Prayer for Christian Unity always falls between January 18th-25th, traditionally important feasts of the Apostles Peter and Paul (January 18th was formerly the Feast of St. Peter's Chair-at-Rome). These words of Cardinal Newman, himself a convert from Anglicanism, set the tone for our praver.





THE EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION FOR 2024 IN THE YEAR OF GRACE (The Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts:)

Know, dear brethren, that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of His Resurrection who is our Savior:

The 28th Day of January is the Sunday of Septuagesima. On the 14th Day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the Fast of the most sacred Lenten Season.

On the 31st Day of March you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 9th Day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 19th Day of May, the Feast of Pentecost. On the 30th Day of May, the Feast of Corpus Christi.

On the 1st Day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.



Lesson (First Reading): First Samuel 3:3b-10, 19 ("Speak, LORD, for Your servant is listening." Epistle (Second Reading): I Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20 ("Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ.") Gospel Lesson: Adoration of the Magi Matthew 2:1-12 ("Behold, the Lamb of God.")



"Brethren: The body is not for immorality [fornication], but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by His power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is

joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with Him. Avoid immorality ["fly fornication"]. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own?..."



### LATIN MASS PROPERS: SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

**INTROIT:** Psalm 65. 4, 1-2 Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy Name, O Most High. *Psalm*. Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His Name: give glory to His praise. V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.  $\mathbb{R}$ . Amen. — Let all the earth ...

**COLLECT:** O almighty and everlasting God, who dost govern all things both in heaven and on earth: mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace in our time. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ...

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 12. 6-16 Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either prophecy to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, with honor preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful; in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the Saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another: not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

**GRADUAL:** Psalm 106. 20-21 The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men. **ALLELUIA Psalm 148. 2** Alleluia, alleluia. Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. John 2. 1-11 **A**t that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the Mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the Mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His Mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six water-pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the water-pots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth to the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine, and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse; but thou has kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee: and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him. —
