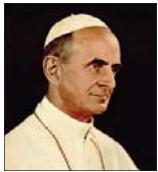

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER: THE PATRONAGE OF SAINT JOSEPH

The Third Sunday after Easter (which is today) recalls one of the historical feasts of the Church's Liturgy. This Feast is the Patronage of Saint Joseph. Pope Pius IX instituted it in 1847 and appointed its observance for the Third Sunday after Easter. Later, it was moved to the Wednesday after Good Shepherd Sunday (Wednesday of this past week) and observed as an Octave. This observance prevailed until 1955 when Pope Pius XII superseded it with a new feast of St. Joseph the Workman, which is fixed on May 1st. It is this May-day Feast of St. Joseph which serves as our Easter Feast of St. Joseph today.

It is fitting that St. Joseph should receive a special feast during Paschaltide for many reasons, among them the expression of Joseph's particular joy in the Resurrection of Christ. Mary received the appearance of her Son and Savior on Easter Sunday. Joseph, however,

was re-united with Christ hours earlier, when Christ descended to the “Limbo of the Fathers”, the “Bosom of Abraham”, on Good Friday after His death on the Cross. St. Joseph was among the just souls who awaited their deliverance from the netherworld and St. Joseph was among the ‘first-fruits’ of the Saints to enter Heaven with Christ on Ascension Day.

This is a moment of the Easter celebration to contemplate the glorification of St. Joseph together with Jesus’ Resurrection and to understand how that powerfulness of his prayers from Heaven on our behalf stems from it.

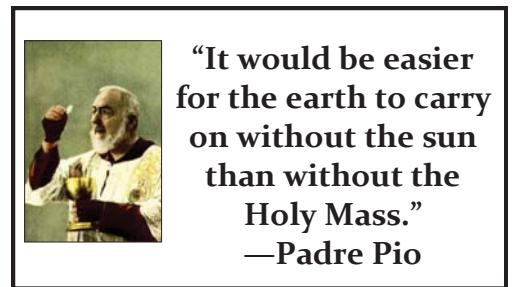
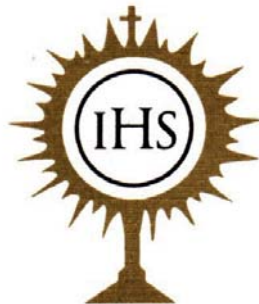

LATIN MASS PROPERS: THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

INTROIT: *Psalm 65.* 1-3 Shout with joy to God, all the earth, alleluia: sing ye a psalm to His Name, alleluia: give glory to His praise, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm.* Say unto God: How terrible are Thy works, O Lord! In the multitude of Thy strength Thine enemies shall lie to Thee. *V̄.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Shout with joy ...

COLLECT: O God, who to those that go astray dost show the light of Thy truth, that they may return to the path of justice: grant that all who are enrolled in the Christian faith, may both spurn all that is hostile to that name, and follow after what is fitting to it. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son...

EPISTLE: From First Epistle of Blessed Peter the Apostle (I Peter 2. 11-19) Dearly beloved: I beseech you, as strangers and pilgrims, to refrain yourselves from carnal desires, which war against the soul, having your conversation good among the Gentiles; that whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by the good works which they shall behold in you, glorify God in the day of visitation. Be ye subject therefore to every human creature for God's sake: whether it be to the king as excelling, or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of the good: for so is the will of God, that by doing well you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men: as free, and not as making liberty a cloak for malice, but as the servants of God. 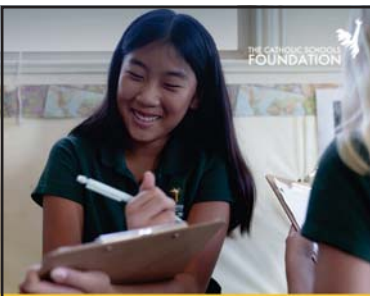

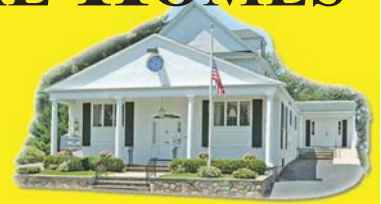

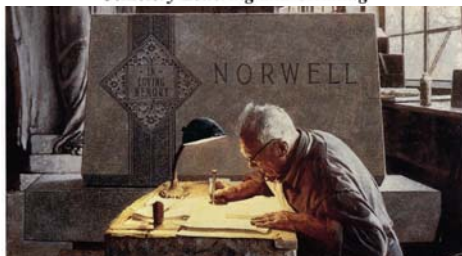
