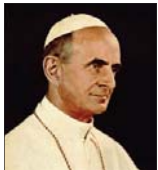

EASTER AND THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Three of the Seven Sacraments of the Church are known as the *Sacraments of Christian Initiation*. They are Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. When an adult catechumen is baptized, the other two Sacraments of Christian Initiation should be part of that event. On Easter Eve at our Easter Vigil three of our new parishioners received Sacraments of Christian Initiation. **Robin Anastasia Thérèse Hollis** received all three as she was re-born in Baptism. Two other men were welcomed into full-Communion with the Catholic Church, having been baptized in Protestant churches. They received Confirmation and Holy Communion thus completing their Christian Initiation. Together with Robin we welcome **Julian Pereira (Confirmation name: Thomas Aquinas) & Peter Bauer (Confirmation name: Louis Martin [the father of St. Thérèse])**. These accompanying photos are of the Baptismal Regeneration part of the Easter Vigil Ceremony. Just prior to the Baptism and Confirmations, all received the sprinkling of the newly blessed Easter water, a symbol of our Baptism.

COLLECT: O God, who makest the faithful to be of one mind and will: grant to Thy people the grace to love what Thou dost command and to desire what Thou dost promise, that amid the changes of the world, our hearts may there be fixed where true joys are to be found. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Epistle of Blessed James the Apostle (James 1. 17-21) Dearly beloved, every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no change nor shadow of alteration. For of His own will hath He begotten us by the word of truth, that we might be some beginning of His creature. You know, my dearest brethren. And let every man be swift to hear but slow to speak and slow to anger. For the anger of man worketh not the justice of God.
